Hope Revival Organization (HRO) Organizational Chart

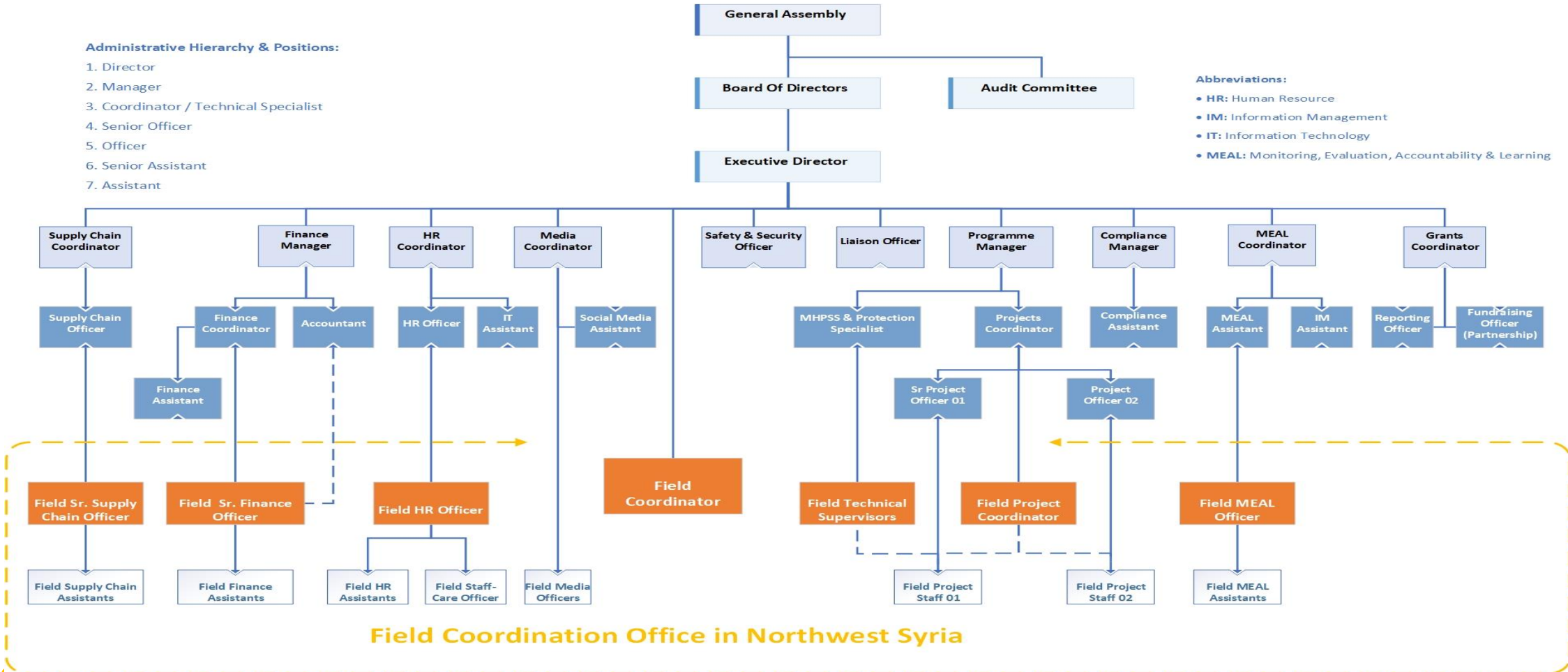

OUR Programmes

- **Mental Health and Psychosocial Support (MHPSS):** We provide **multi-layered MHPSS** services according to the IASC MHPSS Pyramid, offering a range of interventions from **psychiatrists** and **mhGAP doctors** to **psychologists** and **psychosocial workers (PSWs)**. We also integrate MHPSS services into health facilities and community centers to make them more accessible and reduce stigma.
- **Protection:** We address **GBV, CP, and GP issues**, including RE awareness-raising and legal awareness counseling by local lawyers on CSD/HLP.
- **Protection from Sexual Exploitation and Abuse (PSEA) and child safeguarding:** We implement robust policies and procedures to protect vulnerable individuals from PSEA and ensure child safeguarding measures are in place through awareness raising and using innovative technology to sensitize humanitarian workers.
- **Peacebuilding and community resilience:** We facilitate peacebuilding initiatives and community resilience programs to foster social cohesion, mutual understanding, and collaboration within affected communities.

Protection

- Focused Non-specialized (PSWs): Bio-psycho-social assessment, PM+, individual consultation & PFA.

Peacebuilding and Community Resilience

HRO launched the Stabilizing Vulnerable Communities (SVC) in the NWS through the Promotion of Inter-Community Dialogue in 2022

The goal of the SVC program was for the communities to work together to peacefully manage tensions and rebuild community cohesion with three key objectives:

- Strengthening the capacity of local leaders in communities to resolve community conflicts and deal with the legacy of violence in an open, inclusive, and sustainable manner.
- Reinforcing sustainable dispute resolution methods and generating increased trust through joint social and economic initiatives benefiting the communities.
- Promoting attitudes of tolerance and non-violence through the support of inter-faith and inter-ethnics peace messaging.

Through: developing one training package, TOT & Rol-out training, Structured Community Dialogue sessions, Community awareness-raising including specific sessions for adolescents and children, Community initiatives/Campaigns, and producing Child Friendly awareness videos on peacebuilding and community resilience.



Our unique Projects

- I. **Rethinking Arts for Cohesion, Trust, and Inclusion (REACT-IN):** This EU-funded project, in partnership with ARCS and Bologna University, developed and published an art therapy training toolkit in three languages for NGOs working with vulnerable youth.
- II. **Clinical Supervision Framework:** This framework, developed in partnership with CVT, provides guidance and support for MHPSS staff.
- III. **Academic Research “Care for Carers”** This ELRHA-funded study, in partnership with UNSW University, aims to improve the quality of MHPSS programming through video conferencing clinical supervision.
- IV. **Child Rights Protection against Violence:** This CFLI-funded project uses child-friendly content to develop children's advocacy, defense, and human rights comprehension skills.
- V. **Media Coverage in the Humanitarian Context:** This CFLI-funded project aims to provide Capacity Building for 100 Journalists on gender dimensions, human rights, humanitarian principles, GBV, gender stereotypes, and gender discrimination in narratives surrounding the conflict (i.e. honor crime, child marriage) in addition to develop and publish a Guideline for Journalist and Communication Specialist funded by CFLI.
- VI. **Human Rights Advocacy Toolkit** In partnership with NEAR, OXFAM, and UNHCR, HRO participate in developing a human rights advocacy toolkit to address protection gaps in Syria.

Our unique Projects cont'd

- VII. **Psychosocial Support for Syrian Victims of War Crimes:** This project provides psychosocial support to Syrians who may testify or participate in European universal jurisdiction trials
- VIII. **Self-awareness and Reading App (SARA) Mobile Application:** Designed to empower frontline workers, community actors, and the conflict-affected population in Syria. SARA delivers essential knowledge on PSEA, encompassing sectors such as Health, Shelter, WASH, Protection, and Education. <https://hope-revival.ngo/sara-app/>
- IX. **Empowering Through Education:** Our in-school psychosocial support services project is dedicated to creating safe and nurturing learning environments for children. The primary goal is to empower teachers and headmasters, enabling them to guide children through traumas, losses, and psychosocial adversities, while actively engaging in child protection activities.
- X. **Multi and specialized MHPSS capacity developing Programmes** for MHPSS worker including developing Self-Staff care guideline.
 - I. **Older People structured MHPSS:** Provide life-saving and life-sustaining humanitarian assistance to the most vulnerable Older People and PWD
 - II. **Improving the health care and the economic security of older people in NW Syria.**
- VII. **(NAFSY - My Psychological):** Promoting access to mental health services and supports for refugee populations using a suite of technology-based mental health solutions through a mobile application (e-therapy).

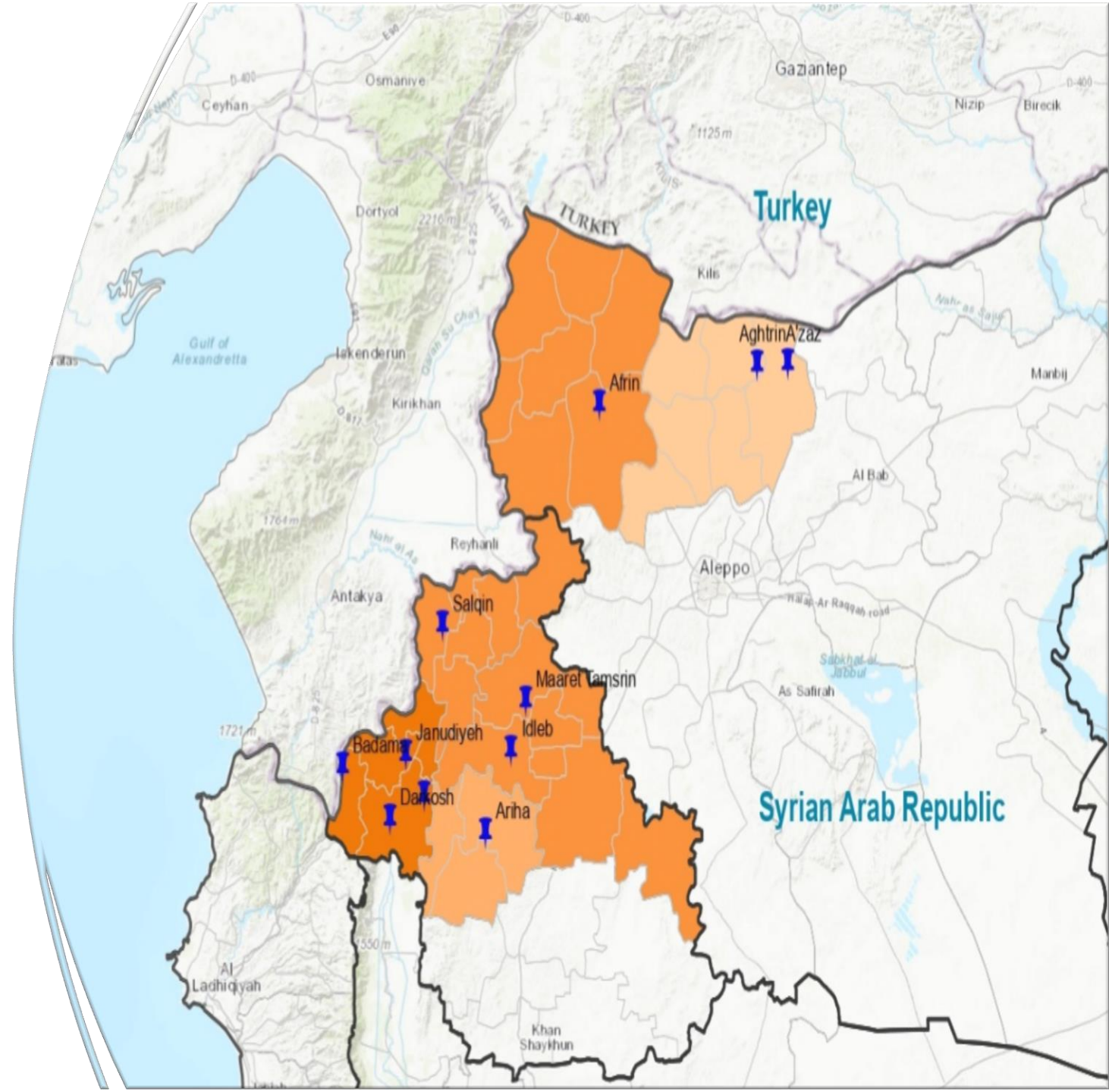

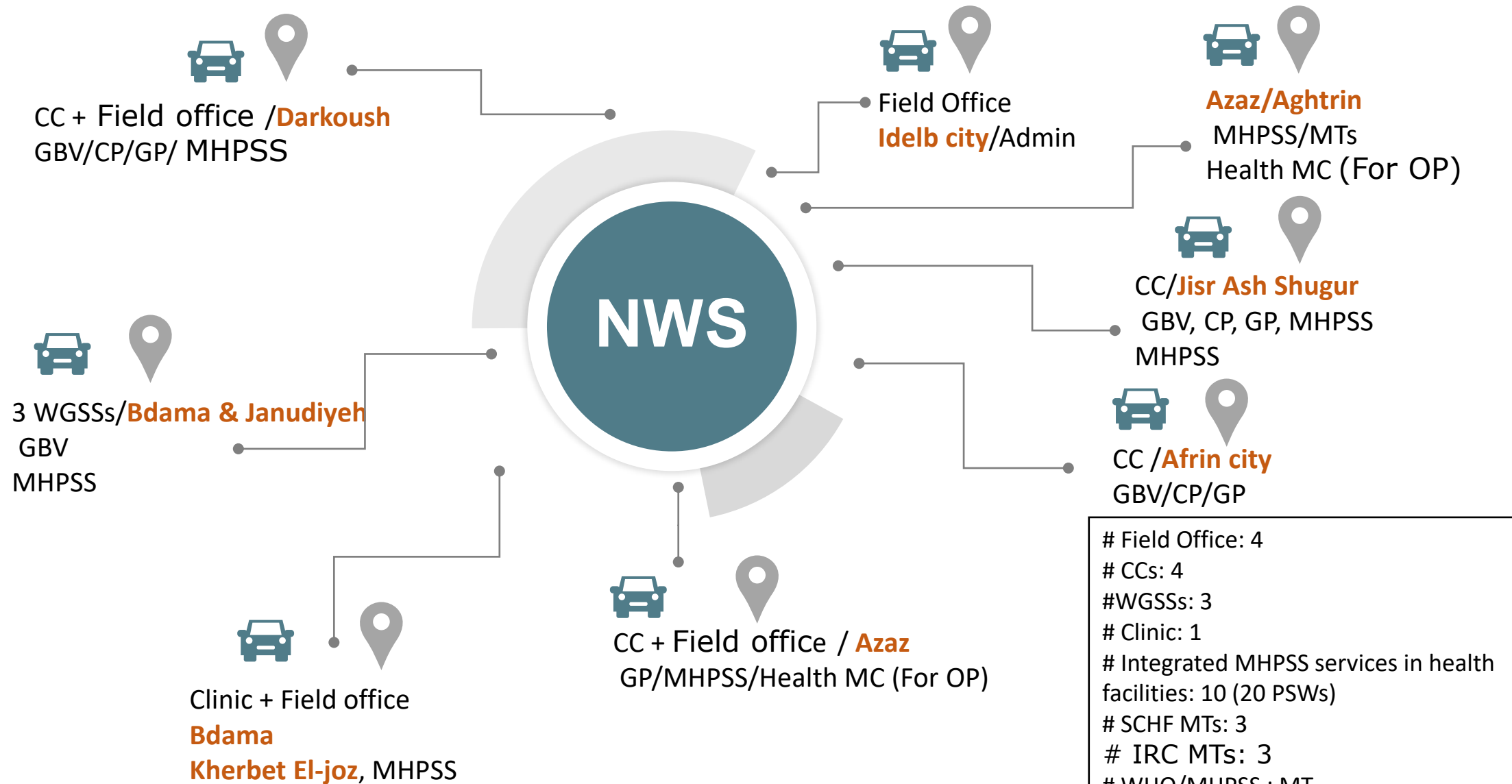

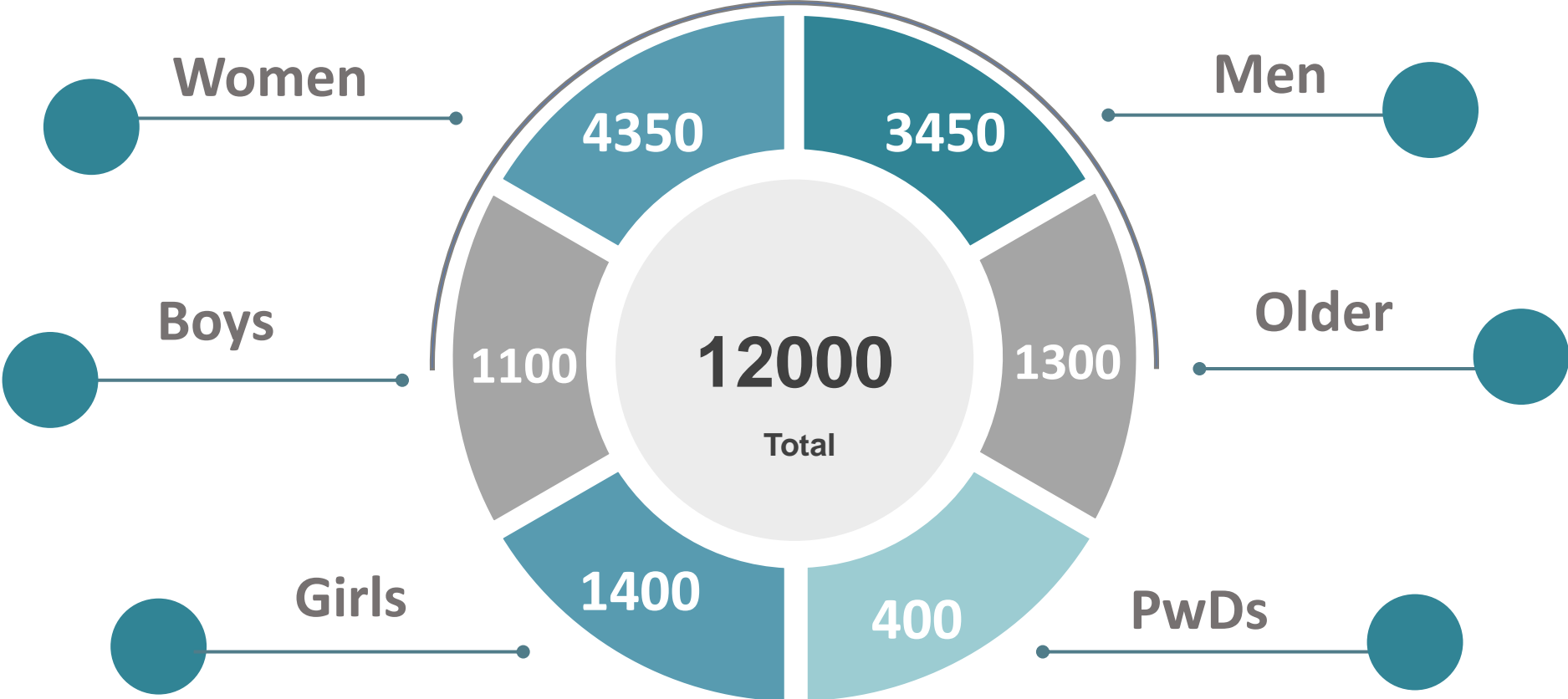

Average Monthly Statistics



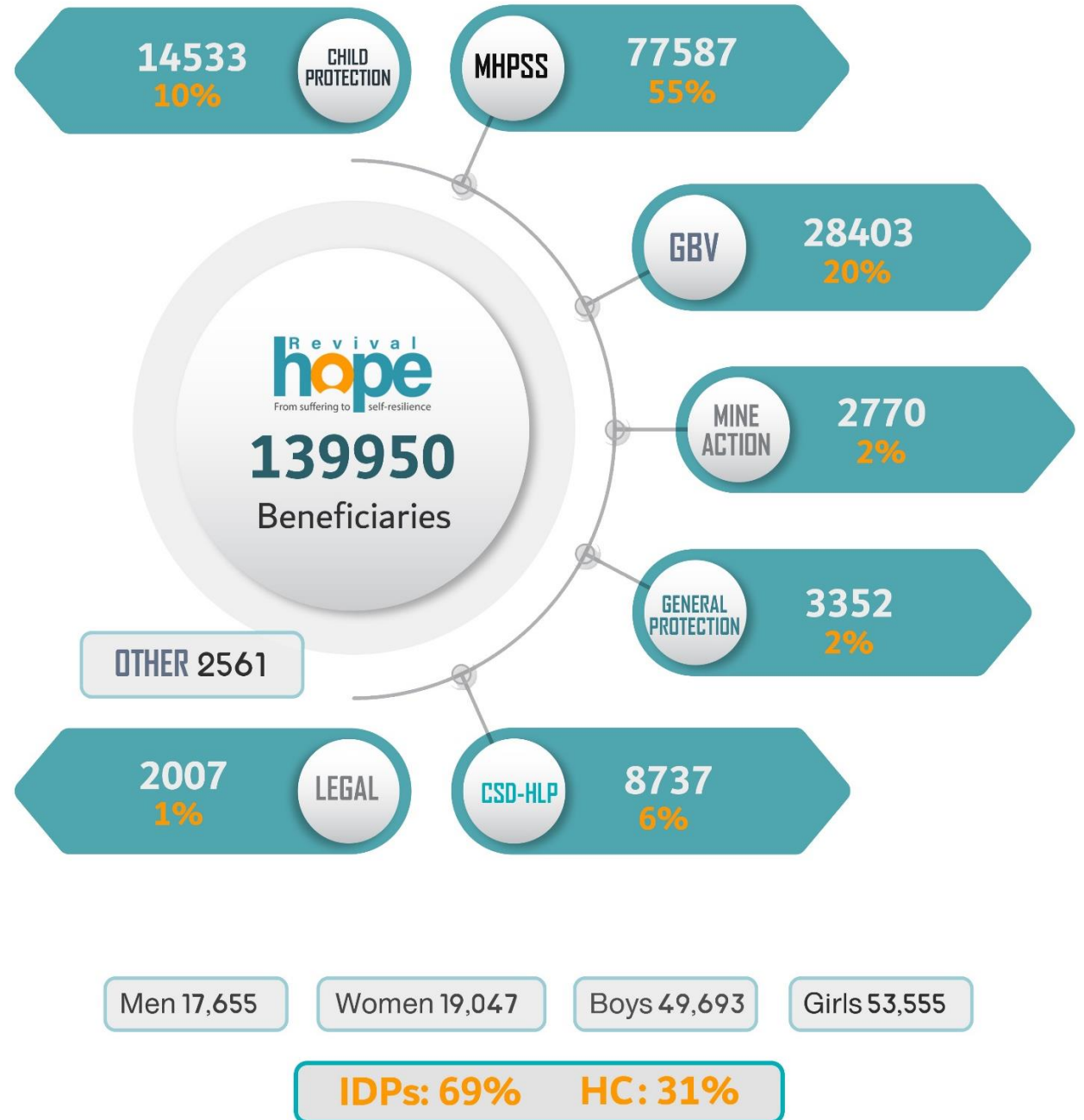
SUPPORT BY PROGRAMME AND TOTAL NUMBER OF BENEFICIARIES IN 2022

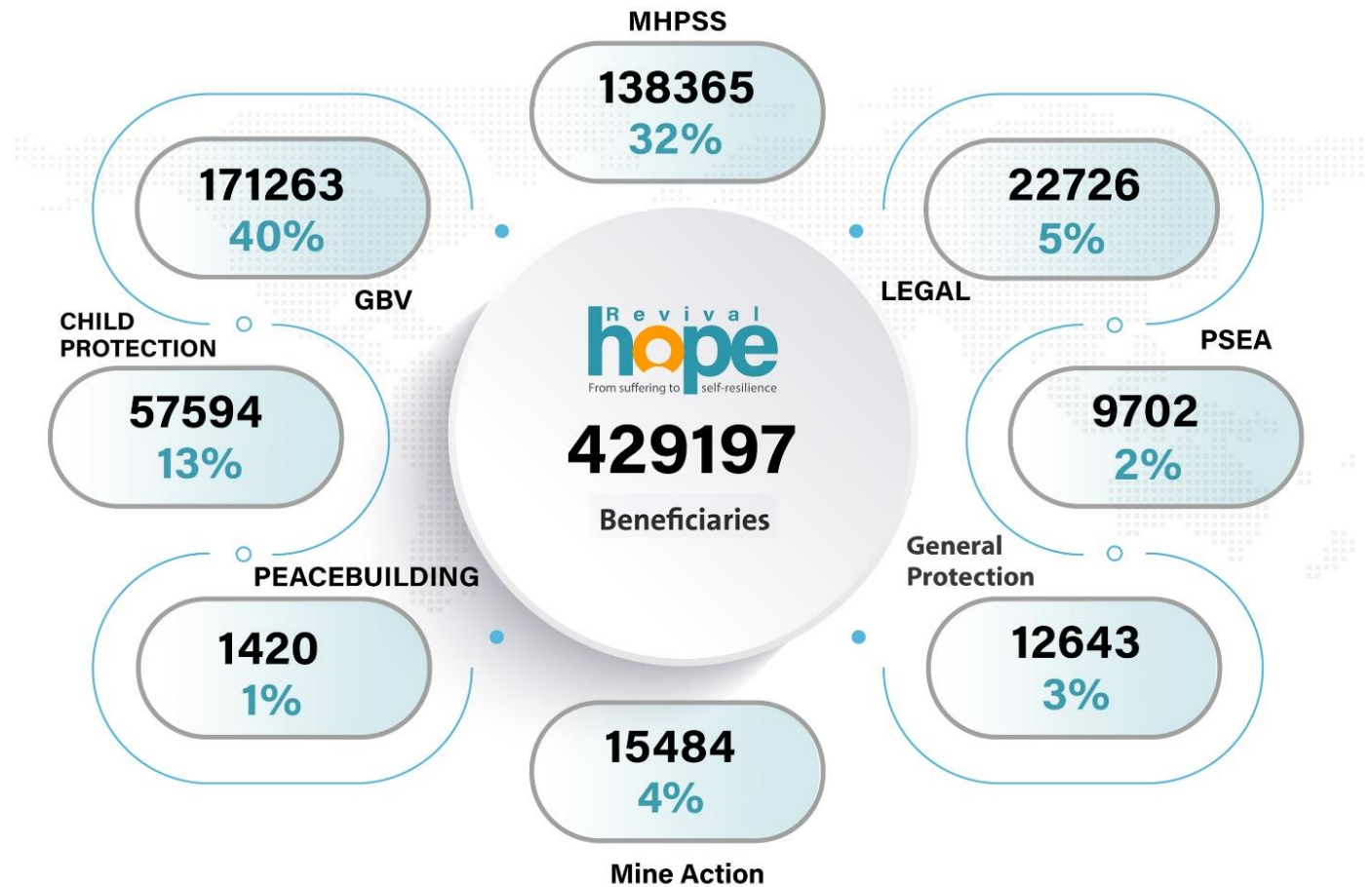
