



- (MPC) is a non-profit and non-governmental organization, established in the Gaza Strip in 1994 according to the law, and it was licensed by the Palestinian Ministry of Interior in 1998 under No. 5043, and it works under the supervision and coordination with the Ministry of Social Development, with a license from the Ministry of Health, and a license from the Ministry of Education.
- It is specialized in accommodating persons with disabilities, especially cerebral palsy and multiple disabilities.






About MPC

■ The association works to provide accommodation, care and habilitation services for persons with disabilities who suffer from various difficult social and economic conditions, where the association provides various habilitation services for persons with disabilities such as protection programs, shelter, care, education, capacity building, skills development, and the provision of living in a safe social, psychological and health environment, through specialized and high-quality programs. In addition to recreational activities for psychological relief such as trips, celebrations, camps and sports activities, the association also plays an important role in mobilizing, lobbying and advocacy activities in order to defend the rights of persons with disabilities.



Vision:

The best association to provide comprehensive and integrated habilitation care for people with disabilities with high efficiency at the level of Palestine.



Mission:

Seeking for a safe environment that provides integrated habilitation care for persons with disabilities from the stage of providing alternative family to those who have lost their hosting families to the stages of providing special education, vocational training, habilitation and inclusion programs to improve the standard of life of persons with disabilities and develop their abilities in accordance with the WHO-approved community habilitation matrix.



Goals:

The association aims to achieve the following charitable goals:

Goal:

Contribute to provide a safe and appropriate environment for people with disabilities in Palestine through protection, rehabilitation, capacity development and work with the community.

Objectives:

- 1. Providing shelter (hosting) and care services for people with different disabilities.
- 2. Supporting and strengthening medical and physical habilitation services for people with disabilities through occupational therapy, speech, hearing, and physical therapy.
- 3. Providing social and psychological habilitation services for people with disabilities.
- 4. Providing education services for people with disabilities.
- Enhancing the integration of persons with disabilities in the vocational training program to develop skills that enhance their chances of employment and selfreliance.
- 6. Enhancing the sensitivity of the local community and decision-makers on disability issues through mobilization, lobbying, advocacy and advocacy activities.





Activities:

1- Hosting and Care program

This is the main program for which the center was established, which provides shelter and care services to different categories of persons with disabilities in a safe and appropriate environment and protection from violence and exploitation. The services are provided in two ways:

• Firstly: Permanent Care

Provides Care services within the alternative / custodial family (full accommodation). It targets persons with disabilities who have completely lost family because of various social conditions, such as loss of the breadwinner, family disintegration, unsafe family environment, or the absence of the mother. The program provides them with comprehensive and integrated protection, care and habilitation services and medical support services within the center.

• Secondly: Temporary accommodation

Providing temporary accommodation services to needy PWDs due to emergency social conditions. The residence period does not exceed two weeks and it is may renewable.

2- Daily Care Program

Receiving children with disabilities every day for (6) hours and providing them with the necessary care and habilitation services, such as healthy nutrient meals, physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy, and behavioral modification. Follow-up medication for seizures, psychological support for the child and the family.

3-Early childhood program "Pre-School":

It aims to develop the abilities of children with disabilities like language, movement, sensual, writing, and reading skills by including them in 4 levels of habilitation, which are early intervention capacity development 1,2,3 (preschool)) the children get multiple services such as special education physical therapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy and speech problems and psychological support, according to comprehensive rehabilitation plans and programs.

4- Special Education & Vocational Training Programs:

4.1- Saja - Special Education School

SAJA School provides basic special educational services under the supervision of the Ministry of Education, in addition to supporting medical services such as physiotherapy, speech therapy, and psychological support for students. it aims to rehabilitate them to integrate into their societies. The school staff is expertise, skilled and specialized. The school receives its students in classrooms equipped with the latest educational tools appropriate to the needs and capabilities of the students.

4.2-Vocational Training Program

Persons with disabilities are trained and rehabilitated with the aim of empowering them according to their abilities, skills and interests in an effective manner. The program covers all the needs of young men and women with disabilities by learning life and practical skills, in addition to creating suitable job opportunities and creating a suitable work environment, for their ease of inclusion in the various work environments. Short vocational training courses are offered, such as training on handicrafts and teaching the basics of sewing, in addition to housekeeping, carpet making, and printing on clothes and various utensils, through training either within the center or in partner institutions.

5-Habilitation Services Program "Supportive Medical Services":

Provides various habilitation services, including physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech provides, and swallowing problems and psychological support to all beneficiaries of the center's various programs. In addition to, beneficiaries from external PwDs. These services contribute to the development of kinesthetic, language performance, life activities, and arrive at independence in self-reliance as much as possible, in addition to holding external sessions for cases who are unable to reach the association in their homes in marginalized areas.
