#### Who are we ?

Wekalet Behna is a artistic and culturally inclusive institution focused on film, contemporary arts, education, and research. It challenges cultural norms, encouraging continuous reassessment and evolution. Wekalet Behna engages with local and regional cultural scenes, particularly in Alexandria and its surroundings, where cultural services can be limited.

Wekalet Behna actively contributes to the local artistic and cultural scene through diverse projects, including dialogues, collaborations, publications, and educational programs. Dedicated to fostering critical dialogue and challenging societal beliefs, its ultimate goal is to create a safe space for intellectual development and creative exploration.



## **About Behna Films Selection**



Established in the early 1930s, Behna Films Selection emerged as a pioneering force in Egypt's film industry. The company excelled in film production, distribution, and collaborations with key industry figures. Notably, they produced Egypt's first Arabic talking and musical film, 'Onshondat Al-Fuad,' in 1932 and the inaugural Egyptian animated film, 'Mish-Mish Effendi,' in 1936. Becoming the primary distributor for Egyptian films, the company expanded its presence across the Arab world, North Africa, and Europe.

#### **About Behna Films Selection**

After the 1952 revolution and the subsequent Egyptian nationalization campaign, Behna Films Selection faced expropriation and most family properties came under judicial custody in the early 1960's. In 2014, Basile Behna reclaimed the long-abandoned archives and Alexandria headquarters. However, the archives and the agency suffered major preservation issues due to years of neglect, including dust accumulation, humidity, fungus, and pest damage. Extensive renovation work transformed the agency into a functional workspace and storage unit.

## Overview of the fonds

The Wekalah houses a vast archive consisting of around 50 linear meters of documents and 6000 images, predominantly in French and Arabic ; divided in these categories :

- Posters
- Lobby Cards (as shown)
- Photographs
- Dialogues
- Brochures
- Agreements
- Film tickets statements (Bordereaux)
- Export permits (Avis)
- Film copy permits

- Reports (between Cairo and Alexandria's offices)
- Correspondences
- Distribution permits
- Insurances
- Customs
- Films transfers
- Company's Legal Documentation
- Finances










#### Overview of the fonds

These archives are much more than a mere collection, representing a historical and cultural legacy. There are 287 Egyptian films, 7 foreign films, records of 119 Egyptian cinemas, and 100 cinemas abroad, providing a comprehensive overview of Egypt's cinema evolution from the 1930s to the present.

Despite limited resources, Wekalet Behna has started restoration efforts, renovating archives, and initiating conservation activities since June 2020, aiming to preserve and protect this invaluable cultural heritage.









# The Digital Library

In the past three years, exploring the archives at Wekalet Behna revealed their immense historical and cultural significance, shedding light on Egypt's cinematic past. Preserving these documents presented considerable challenges, prompting innovative strategies for protection. To address limited resources hindering the full operation of a physical database, Wekalet Behna initiated a digital library project in late 2023. Spearheaded by Basile Behna and a team, this effort aims to digitize the materials, prioritizing visual content like brochures, photographs, and posters. The approach involves meticulous digitization, creating high-quality versions while establishing a database to consolidate diverse materials, ensuring accessibility for future generations.

Overcoming logistical and financial hurdles remains crucial to achieving the goal of an accessible online archive, reflecting the institution's commitment to sharing its rich cinematic history.





### Workflow

Cleaning, sorting and indexing the physical material + extracting important information from the documents

## Current and future needs

The project's success relies on securing support from experts and increased resources, aiming to complete this initiative and make the cinematic archive accessible worldwide. Collaborative partnerships with cultural organizations are crucial for preserving this treasure. We are seeking support for a large array of needs :

- Specialists and professional archivists providing expertise
- More team members, in the physical office but also for the data entry positions, ensuring a faster pace of work and a more fluid workflow
- Specific professional training for the team members
- Acid-free archive-grade storage boxes
- Further renovation for the 3 rooms in which the fonds is stored
- A more developed and secured storage system, with 2 NAS in different locations plus a secured cloud storage
- An A3 1200 DPI scanner to be able to digitize the visual material in less steps
